• 'Haircut' for Photinias


Occasionally these sessions will still be provided under the auspices of members of Shutterbugs when and if there is interest.

Taking a STEP into gardens!

On Tuesday 1 August, 20 Garden Gossipers were treated to an informative talk about the Southern Tablelands Eco Park (STEP) which is a hidden delight at the Arboretum.



From bare paddock to a true ecosystem that attracts

over 60 species of birds and showcases endemic plants of the region, the gardens have a lovely spot to visit and to learn about what grows and can be grown in our area.

With Wattle Day approaching, it was interesting to learn that the gardens have a "wattle walk" that features 31 of the 34 species that grow in the region. (I was pleased to learn that one of the self-sown wattles outside Gumnut Cottage was a true local, so has been saved from the pruning shears. I also learned the difference between sedge



and reeds - something that may come in handy one day at a trivia.)

Davd and Jenny were generous with their time and were happy to field questions from the audience including what to plant to beat out the evil African love grass and spent time chatting with the group over refreshments (included a fabulous rhubarb and banana cake made by Jill Pietzker).

STEP is a solely volunteer program which relies on donations and small grants. Garden Gossipers generously added their support to STEP by putting donations into dish appropriately decorated with a wattle image.

<u>TALKING TASTY</u> <u>A LITTLE FRIDAY FRIVOLITY!</u>

BARBIE BALLS

What better way to celebrate Barbie-mania sweeping the globe right now than with bright pink, no-bake dessert balls. This recipe is super-easy, combining retro Iced Vovo biscuits with just two more ingredients (yes, one of them is condensed milk!) to create sweet jammy-centred truffles. And of course, they have to be coated in pink chocolate and pink sprinkles - they can be made up to 2 weeks in advance and stored in an airtight container in the fridge.

On trend and a sweet surprise treat for your next gathering!!

Ingredients

210g pkt Arnott's Iced Vovo biscuits

2 tbsp sweetened condensed milk

2 tbsp raspberry jam

290g pkt white choc melts

Pink food colouring, to tint

Pink sprinkles / Sweetheart sprinkles, to decorate

Method

- Place the biscuits in a food processor and process until finely crushed. Add the sweetened condensed milk and jam and process until well combined. Transfer to a bowl.
- Line a baking tray with baking paper. Roll heaped teaspoonfuls of the biscuit mixture into balls and place on the prepared tray. Place in the fridge for 30 minutes to chill.
- Place the choc melts in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave, on medium, stirring every minute with a metal spoon, for 2-3 minutes or until melted and smooth. Add pink food colouring to tint.
- Use a fork to dip the balls into the melted chocolate to coat, allowing excess chocolate to drip off. Return to the tray. Sprinkle with sprinkles to decorate. Set aside for 5 minutes to set. Serve.

Save time by booking your visit to Access Canberra in advance

If a visit to Access Canberra is on your to-do list, you're in luck. Bookable appointments are now available at all Service Centres.

You can book in a visit up to two weeks in advance. Bookings can be made by:

BY CALLING 13 22 81

Bookable appointments were first introduced at the Dickson Specialised Centre in 2022 and after positive feedback from community members, the program has been introduced at the Belconnen, Gungahlin, Woden, and Tuggeranong Service Centres.

By booking an appointment in advance, you can save time and streamline your visit to Access Canberra.

Once you've booked your appointment, you'll receive confirmation via text and email. If you need to reschedule or cancel your appointment, you can use the confirmation text or email to do this.

If you prefer to visit Access Canberra on short notice whenever the mood takes you, don't stress. You can continue to visit Service Centres at Belconnen, Gungahlin, Woden and Tuggeranong without an appointment, you may just have to join a queue.

Remember you can do most Access Canberra transactions online, including car rego renewal, paying parking fines, applying for a birth or marriage certificate and much more.

The only transactions that need to be done in person are registrations that require a photo – driver's licence, proof of identity, or working with vulnerable people card – or for vehicle related transactions such as new or transfer of registration.
