## A DAY IN THE COUNTRY THURSDAY 20 OCTOBER



Our next trip will be a combined one, again with Probus of Club Tuggeranong and this time we are going over the boarder to the historical town of Yass.

Departing from Vikings Town Centre Club Tuggeranong at 9.00 am, we will have morning tea in Yass at the delightful Tootsie Gallery Cafe, a choice of tea or coffee with either a homemade scone, jam and cream or a brownie. This eclectic gallery is perfect for a stroll around while your coffee is being made.

After morning tea, a representative from the Historical Society of Yass will join us for a coach tour of the interesting sights of Yass. Settled in the early 1820's, Yass was an important service centre and is steeped in history.

We will continue to Bowning for some country cuisine at the Bowning Hotel. Lunch will be alternative services of roast lamb with baked vegetables and brown gravy and roast pork with accompanying vegetables, followed by sticky date pudding with ice-cream and fruit pavlova roulade. Tea or coffee will be available.

Not too long a day, we aim to be back at the Vikings Club by 3.30 pm.

All-inclusive cost is \$70.00 with booking and payment by Thursday 13 October. As we are sharing this trip, please be aware that spaces are limited, so be quick!

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**


"'We'll all be rooned', said Hanrahan" is etched in our psyche and has entered the Australian English lexicon. But did you know it was penned by one of Yass' early sons, Patrick Joseph Hartigan. A parish priest, Hartigan wrote poetry under the pseudonym of John O'Brien and became one of the legendary icons of Australian pioneering literature.

"Said Hanrahan" earliest known publication was in July 1919 in *The Catholic Press*, appearing in 1921 in the anthology *Around the Boree Log and Other Verses*. The poem describes the recurrent natural cycle of droughts, floods and bushfires in rural Australia as seen by "Hanrahan", a pessimistic man of Irish descent.

Born in Yass of Irish parents in 1878, Hartigan was best known as 'Father Pat' and spent most his life in the Riverina of New South Wales. In his affectionate and gently humorous verses, John O'Brien sang of farming life and of the life of Irish settlers in

Australia - at home, on the land, and at the Church upon the Hill that is the centre of their lives. Characters like *Said Hanrahan, The Little Irish Mother, Cooney's Daughter, The Careys* and the irrepressible housekeeper, *Josephine* were some of the personalities he captured. His poetry was very

Josephine were some of the personalities he captured. His poetry was very popular in Australia and was well received in Ireland and the United States. Monsignor Hartigan died in Sydney in 1952.


